

## **Hope's Reopening FAQ**

**Will online services still be available?** Yes, we will continue to offer livestream services.

**How many services are there?** We will hold one service at 10 AM.

**Do I need a reservation?** No, we believe we have enough space between the Worship Center, the overflow and gym to accommodate people.

**Am I required to wear a mask?** While masks are encouraged, they are not required. If you are more comfortable wearing a mask, the overflow section is reserved for those who will wear masks through the entire service and not sing.

**Is my child required to wear a mask?** While masks are encouraged, they are not required.

**Will I be allowed to sing?** We are asking those who want to sing to wear a mask; otherwise we encourage you to listen to the team as they lead worship. If you sit in the overflow, please do not sing.

**Is there childcare or nursery?** Not yet. We are working on assembling a team to roll out Nursery and Kids' Church. Until then, children are welcome to sit with their parents. Busy bags will not be available.

**Is there social distancing?** Yes, the Worship Center, overflow, and gym are set up to accommodate individuals and families at a 6 foot separation. Please leave a 3 chair separation between individuals or families. A screen and audio are set up in the gym to participate in the service.

**Will we have communion?** We will not be serving communion at this time.

**Will the offering basket be passed?** No, we will continue to give online, by text, or by mail.

**Will I receive a bulletin?** We will not be handing out bulletins. Announcements will be shared during the service and on Realm.

**Will the coffee bar be open?** Not at this time. Please feel free to bring coffee from home.

**Are the bathrooms open?** Yes, please use the bathrooms while honoring social distancing.

**Can I stay and socialize inside?** No, please exit the building to socialize. Consider using the grassy area outside the Lower North entrance to socialize at a distance without the worry of traffic.
